ACTIVITY OUTLINE



Revision of key vocabulary: memory game from lesson 1 on Climate Action (worksheets 1c-f); create a mind map in pairs or small groups: choose Spanish terms and stick them onto the mind-map

Draw lines between different terms to show the relationships between the different social and environmental impacts of climate change

Using the help sheet (PPT slide 6) and explain the relationships in Spanish

CURRICULUM OUTCOMES



Develop vocabulary linked to the environmental and social impacts of climate change

Use of authentic resources: read literary texts and listen to audio files in the language (such as personal stories, comments) to stimulate ideas, develop creative expression and expand understanding of the language and culture

Indicate the causes and consequences of a problem in Spanish using connectives and linking words

Students can explain the significance of the threat that Climate Change poses to life-forms on earth

They can describe in simple terms the connection between Climate Change and migration

Students can explain how and why Climate Change affects some places and communities more than others e.g. people in the majority world

Students understand that Climate Change will have an effect on the future of their lives and the lives of everyone in the world

Students can name some different consequences of Climate Change and how these affect people, animals and plants
