### **ACTIVITY OUTLINE**



Introduction of case study: The impact of climate change on coffee farmers in Nicaragua; describing graphics showing the impact of climate change on coffee farmers in Nicaragua using key vocabulary

Listening activities: finding key information using video files from a Nicaraguan coffee farmer (transcripts available in Spanish and English; see worksheet with suggestions of listening activities)

Differentiation:depending on the class, you can play the videos slower with VLC media player,so the pace Karla speaks is a bit more manageable.
